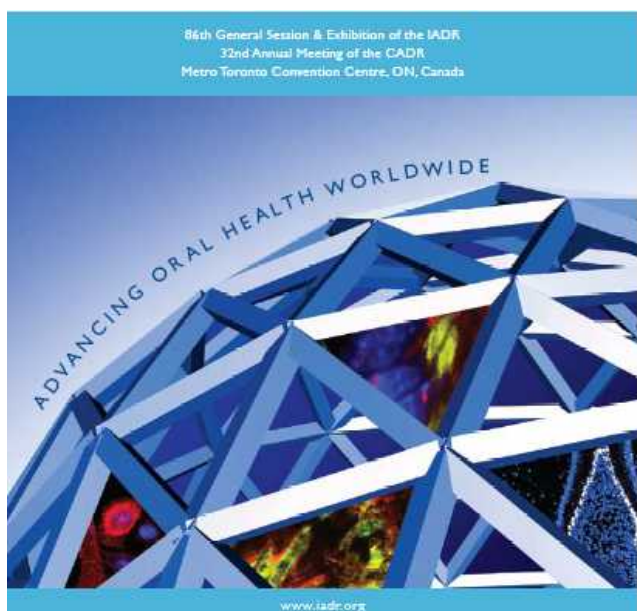

**Annual Financial Report (2006)
Secretary-Treasurer Report**

The Group remains in a strong financial position with a current balance of approximately \$40,000 at the end of the 2006 calendar year.

This was the fourth year for a joint reception with the Implantology Group which have proved to be great and we are sure we would wish to continue. I would like particularly to thank Dr. Clark Stanford, Secretary from the Implantology Group for his work in putting this together and securing the funding continuously.

I would also like to recognize the role of the Whip Mix Corporation who has continued as very loyal supporter of the Frechette Award Competition with its \$1000 grant.

As of December 2006, Central Office indicates 445 members (IADR Members-162, AADR Members-107, IADR Students – 116, AADR Students – 60). Members who have not received the newsletter (emailed two weeks before Toronto meeting) have either not paid their dues to Central Office or have left incorrect email address with Central Office. The record indicates that approximately 20% of the members do not post their email address in the Central Office database. Please check this with Central Office if you have not received any communication.

Councillor Report

The IADR Council meeting was held on Tuesday, March 20, 2007 and the AADR Council meeting was held Wednesday, March 21, 2007 New Orleans, LA. Your Councillor attended both meetings.



Announcements

The New Orleans meeting had 4,632 people registered from 61 countries. They were presented with 592 oral and 2406 poster presentations. Both the IADR meeting in Brisbane and the AADR meeting in Orlando in 2006 were successful.

The contract for Executive Director Chris Fox has been extended for another 5 years.

A new member benefit was implemented this year allowing a PDF of a complete poster to be uploaded and linked to the abstract.

A discussion of whether to consider integration of future meetings of the AADR and ADEA resulted in the Board agreeing to discuss at their May meeting if they should try and do this for the 2010 meeting.

IADR has reinstated the Isaac Schour Memorial Award through a generous endowment from Dr. Bernard Samat.

Elections

The following election results were announced. Online voting continues to be a high percentage of the total votes received. An error in the voting process for the electronic vote was detected early and corrected. It did not affect the outcome of the vote, however, a new vendor will be sought for future elections.

The winners for the 2007 IADR Distinguished Scientist Awards were announced, and Clark Stanford received the Distinguished Scientist Award for Research in Prosthodontics and Implants. We all extend him hearty congratulations on this recognition of his significant contributions.

The AADR Constitutional Amendment was approved and the NSRG student representative will now have a vote on the Board of Directors.

Meetings

The IADR General Session rotation cycle calls for the meeting to be held in South America in 2012. Several sites in Brazil were considered, but Rio de Janeiro seemed to have the best facilities to accommodate the group. The meeting will be combined with the Brazil Division meeting and could be one of the Associations largest meetings. The motion to select Rio de Janeiro was passed unanimously.

For the 2013 IADR meeting, both Honolulu and Seattle were considered. Due to travel issues and attendance estimates, Seattle was unanimously approved as the site for the 2013 IADR meeting.

Finances

It is clear that the operation of both the IA and AADR are highly dependent on income from the annual session. In general, only 15% of the associations' costs are supported by dues, with over 50% supported by meeting registrations. This is a very fragile model and restricts severely where meetings can be held. Angus Walls suggested that there be a dues increase in the higher income countries over the next 5-8 years, to bolster the financial security of the organizations. The highest IA dues would move up to \$130 by 2012. Tiered dues subsidy for lower income nations would still continue. Student members dues will be increased in the high-income countries. No increases in AADR dues are anticipated before 2009

Overall, the financial outlook is relatively good for both IADR and AADR organizations, due to the extensive portfolio and the profit made by the Journal of Dental Research. However, AADR is having some difficulty covering annual operating costs, and it was expected that an allocation from the portfolio of \$61,000 will be needed to balance the 2007 budget. The audit of 2005 was approved and it reflected a very positive review.

The diversification of the investment portfolio has led to gains of 6.4% in 2005 and at the end of August, 2006, and additional gain of 5.6% was seen.

Journals

Journal Editor, Tony Smith, reported that the Journal is healthy, but the changing publishing environment is making it difficult to remain status quo. Issues of open access and funding agency requirements for depositing copies of papers in electronic repositories are key issues. The 489 submission for the past year represent a slight increase over the prior year. Acceptance rate has remained constant at 31%. There is an increase in the global nature of the authors, with 65% being from outside the US. There scientific impact factor (SIF) was up slightly at 3.19. The SIF for JDR remains the highest of the dental journals.

Strategic Plan Committee

Stephen Bayne provided an overview of the strategic planning process and structure. Many of the small divisions have grouped into federations, but the federations don't have a direct link to the IADR central office. There is a proposal to have regional boards, and the IADR Board would work directly with them. Thus the Federations would become regions: Asian/Pacific; African/Middle East; European; Latin America; North America. The Federations were mostly formed to handle regional meetings, but the Regional Boards would be involved in a broader range of activities.

In the discussion of "regionalization", Stephen Bayne indicated that the Scientific Groups role has not been thought out. There was additional comment that there may be questions whether the Scientific Groups that now exist are the ones we need for the future.

A constitutional change to organize the Divisions into Regions was approved.

Other Action Items

The applications for a Uruguayan Section and a Mongolian Section were approved unanimously.

AAADR approved a Policy Statement on the Use of Stem Cells in Dental Research.

Twenty-two new investigators in Prosthodontics applied for one of the two 2008 Arthur R. Frechette Research Awards in Prosthodontics. Eleven submitted for Prosthodontic research undertaken with a Materials Science or Bioengineering oriented protocol and eleven for Prosthodontic research undertaken with a Biological Sciences and Tissue Engineering oriented protocol. Each award carries a cash prize of \$1,000.

The abstracts were be judged for (1) originality and scientific design of the investigation, (2) suitability of the methods of analysis, and (3) scientific value of the work and six finalists will be judged at the 2008 IADR meeting in Toronto, Ontario, Canada (July 2, 2008) and the winner will be announced at the Prosthodontics Group Business Meeting.

The winners of the 2007 Frechette Awards were presented at the International Association for Dental Research annual meeting in New Orleans, Louisiana.



The Frechette is the annual research competition for new investigators sponsored by the Prosthodontics Research Group of the International Association for Dental Research and honoring the memory of Arthur R. Frechette who served as Secretary-Treasurer of the IADR from 1968 until 1977. Pre-Prosthetic Regenerative Science Award Presentation 2007 and 2008 Preview

IADR (International Association for Dental Research) Prosthodontics Research Group has established a new award called Pre-Prosthetic Regenerative Science Award for Young Investigators. The award recognizes original research by new investigators in the multidisciplinary field of pre-prosthetic or prosthodontics-related regenerative science, including tissue engineering, bone, tooth and soft-tissue regenerative sciences, graft materials research, maxillofacial reconstructive biology and physiology and implant biological research. The awards are co-sponsored by the IADR

Prosthodontics Research Group and Japan Prosthodontic Society. The abstracts must be submitted to the Prosthodontics Research Group Poster Session, and the selected finalists will be asked to submit a 5-page extended abstract to complete. Awards will be presented during the annual business meeting of the group during the IADR General Session. See the detail at <http://www.dentalresearch.org/awards/preprost.html>.

First-time memorable First Place Winner awarded at the 2007 New Orleans IADR was Dr. Naoki Tsukimura for his study entitled "Co-Culture Effect of Peripheral Blood Mononuclear Cells on Osteoblasts". The Second Place Winners were Drs. Tatsuhide Hayashi and Kensuke Sekiya for their works on "Possibility of Bone Regeneration by induced bone-like tissue in vitro" and "Novel Transcription Factors for Mesenchymal Stem Cells Osteogenesis", respectively.

For 2008 Toronto Meeting, 4 finalists have been selected and submitted the extended abstract for competition. The finalists are Dr. Yamada for "A newly-found osteogenic enhancing molecule for bone regeneration", Dr. Kobayashi for "Cyclic Strain Promotes Myogenesis of Bone Marrow Stromal Stem Cells", Dr. Moriyama for "The Enhancement of Peri-implant Osteogenesis by Local Application of Statin" and Dr. Ueno for "N-acetyl cysteine protects osteoblastic function from oxidative stress". The first and second place winners will be announced in the Prosthodontic Group Business Meeting on Thursday 5 PM July 3.

● Group Program Chair's Preview for 2008 Toronto

The 2008 Dallas AADR meeting was exceptionally small. Prosthodontics researchers presented 10 oral and 20 poster presentations and our keynote speaker (Dr. Takahiro Ogawa presenting "Technological Breakthroughs for More Biocompatible and Bioactive Pre-prosthetic and Prosthetic Devices and Materials") were scheduled for Prosthodontic Research out of a total of about 1250 papers.



The 30 papers were scheduled for 2 oral (Clinical Prosthodontics and Advances in Dental Ceramics and Keynote Address and Advances in Prosthodontics.) and 4 poster sessions (Prosthodontic Research: Student Abstracts, Biomechanics and Materials Considerations in Prosthodontics, Ceramics, Color Science, and Esthetics and Removable Prosthodontics and Endodontic Restorations).

The Toronto meeting will be much larger. There were 189 submitted (5.2% of the 3632 total abstracts submitted), 2 transferred in, 2 transferred out and 6 of the accepted papers benefited from the English Language Assistance Program. There will be six oral sessions (Arthur R. Frechette Research Awards Finalists, Properties of Fixed Protheses, Properties of Zirconia and Clinical Evaluations of Ceramic Restorations, Clinical Investigations of Fixed Prosthodontics, Keynote Address and Biological Investigations, Esthetic and Functional Considerations in Prosthodontics and Outcomes of Prosthodontic Treatment. The keynote address will be presented by the 2007 Research in Prosthodontics and Implants award winner Dr. Clark M. Stanford. Dr. Stanford's research areas deal with osteoblastic gene expression as a function of cell shape and the role of substratum topography on gene expression. Additionally, Prosthodontics has co-sponsored symposia on "Knowledge Translation: How to Get Your Research to the People to Whom it Matters Most" and "Biomechanical Response and Control at the Bone-Biomaterial Interface"
